I have responded to emergencies for lost person, tornado and traffic emergencies.

Milton Township CERT has a Metra Rail training every other year. The past three trainings I have been one of the leaders planning the event. The event consists of two parts-classroom instruction and hands on practice. MT CERT coordinates training with the Metra Rail staff to provide how to shut off train engines, open the doors from the outside, open the windows and basic rail safety. The hands on activities include extraction, medical treatment, cribbing, transport, triage and IC. We bring in first responders to the hands on portion to help with training as well as to learn to work together. We have trained over 250 CERT people for a Metra Rail response.
